1.3 Rationale for Proposed New Name (Answer the following questions)

1.3.1 *Describe the rationale for the proposed name change.*

The MA program in Faculté Saint-Jean has been given a first level heading of "Études Canadiennes." This name does not capture nor reflect the reality of the program of study of the students, nor their research. In general, "Études Canadiennes" refer to a narrow field of research that focuses mostly on political sciences: in the collective scholarship, it could be viewed as a sub-field of political sciences in Canada. However, the MA in FSJ goes beyond the scope of political sciences: It is truly an interdisciplinary program that places Canada in the center of various fields transcending Political sciences. A survey of the last 10 years of research project carried at FSJ shows a wealth of interdisciplinary topics: health, communities, social impact, culture, gender, business, economic development, history, to name just a few.



By adding interdisciplinary to the title, we ensure that our MA encompasses all the research work conducted by students for the MA at FSJ.

1.3.2 Is comparable nomenclature used for similar programs/specializations offered across Campus Alberta and, where relevant, in other jurisdictions?

To our knowledge, there is not such program in the province. This is a unique program, offered only at FSJ in French. The two new courses on interdisciplinary research are innovative, and at the cutting edge of new perspectives on teaching within an open and collaborative academic world.

Students, with diverse research interests, interact with each other where various disciplines form a collaborative basis for a dynamic interaction of research methods concepts and approach in interdisciplinary graduate education. In both the new courses, students learn about the fundamentals of research while exploring a vast array of topics in Canadian studies. Among these studies, there is gender, women studies, International law and the Canadian north, sustainable economy, social and educational inclusion and diversity, to name a few.

The courses are taught by teams of professors who interact continuously to provide students with innovative approaches and methods to learn of theoretical concepts and application of these concepts to new and emergent topics. The courses were approved last year, and this year, both courses were introduced to the new cohorts in their new format and topics. It has been a wonderful experience for the students to work collaboratively in their courses instead of working in isolation course by course. They benefited from the interdisciplinary of the work they did last semester.

2.1.1 Were students consulted regarding this proposed name change? If so, what was the feedback received as a result of this consultation?

Yes, students were part of the consultations process and they have asked to have more details to their transcript so that potential employers do not dismiss their degree as being purely 'political sciences.'

FSJ has a 'comité des études supérieures' where graduate students are represented: all decision pertaining to programs are discussed in this committee. Student representative in this committee is well informed of this.

The Associate Dean graduate studies consulted with students at the Graduate Students Association of Faculté Saint-Jean" for their feedback and approval as part of the government process for this name change request. They unanimously approved of the addition to the name.

2.1.2 *Describe benefits for students of proposed new name.*



- The new name clearly depicts what students degree is about. They all see themselves represented in this degree.
- Students are able to find adequate employment that clearly fit within their program of study.
- Students are trained in interdisciplinary research perspective, given them hence an edge in working in diverse and bilingual context.
