5. Proposed Assessment and Grading Policy Suite (in UAPPOL) and Proposed Revisions to University Calendar Section 23 (Academic Regulations) and Corresponding Rescission of Sections 52 (Examinations) and 61 (Grading System) of the GFC Policy Manual

Purpose of the Proposal: To rescind existing GFC Policy Manual assessment and grading policies and procedures (Sections 52 and 61) and provide, instead, relevant (and revised) assessment and grading policy and procedures in the UAPPOL environment and to revise accordingly current University Calendar

assessment and grading regulations, as set out in Section 23 (Academic Regulations).

#### Discussion:

Dr Connor explained to members that the proposed Assessment and Grading Policy suite, the attendant revisions to existing grading/assessment policy and procedures, and corresponding rescissions of existing affected regulations, as appropriate, were based extensively on the work carried out in this arena by past-Provost's Fellow, Professor Robert Luth (Department of Earth and Atmospheric Sciences). Dr Connor noted that the changes needed to be made in order to comply with the ongoing transition of institutional policy and procedure into the UAPPOL environment. He explained that the Students' Union (SU) had a series of suggested revisions to the proposed policy suite, which were provided to members in a handout distributed at the meeting by Mr Emerson Csorba, SU Vice-President (Academic).

At this point in the meeting, Dr Connor turned the chair over to Ms Ada Schmude, Associate Registrar and Director of Records, so that he would be free to speak to the proposal and respond to members' questions and concerns.

During the ensuing discussion, members centered on the amendments provided by the SU.

The presenter and members addressed questions, comments, and concerns including, but not limited to, the following: the wealth of diversity at the University of Alberta that prevents excessive specificity in the policy suite; the need to keep terminology congruent with what now appears in the University Calendar; defining what the SU perceives as "assessment criteria;" the amount of work that mandating rubrics would create for instructors, Departments, and Faculties; the desire for clear communication between professors and students; the adverse effects of 'grading on the curve'; encouraging professors to express expectations rather than mandating it; concern that the proposed amendment to include assessment criteria in the course syllabi would be micromanaging the professors' classrooms; the appropriateness of trusting instructors to carry out assessment and grading to the best of their abilities; reiteration of the fact not all Faculties (and, hence, the instructors within) assign letter grades to each assignment completed by students; clarification of the differences between "marking" and "grading;" whether or not communicating all changes to assessment and grading practices in the University Calendar is necessary since proposed revisions to the Calendar are subject to a lengthy approval process; expressed concern about Facultyspecific procedures being required to go to General Faculties Council (GFC) for approval; and the need to emphasize that grading on the curve is not required but that some Faculties do have recommended grade distributions.

Motion to Amend I: Csorba/Coulthard

THAT the GFC Academic Standards Committee provide for the addition within the proposed Assessment and Grading Policy of a new point #4 (to fall between the existing points #3 and #4) that reads, as follows: "Clear and transparent assessment criteria should be provided to students throughout the course."

Motion to Amend II: Csorba/Coulthard

THAT the GFC Academic Standards Committee provide for the addition within University Calendar Section 23.4.2 of a new point (f) (to fall between the existing points (f) and (g)) that reads, as follows: "Each assessment is linked to the stated course objectives and/or learning outcomes. Students should be provided with the criteria for these assessments early in and, if necessary, throughout the course."

Dr Connor asked that text never intended by the proposers to appear in the proposed Assessment and Grading Policy be removed—the affected text to be struck appears in point #1 (page 5 of the material before members) and read as follows: "[...] [or the University is committed to the design and delivery of assessment that enables (promotes) the achievement of specified learning outcomes or objectives of courses and programs; [.]" Additionally, a series of 'friendly amendments' were made to page 21 of the proposal to reflect the formally-amended changes set out in the above-noted Motions to Amend; a heading inadvertently dropped from Section 23.4.4 of the University Calendar text (page 21 of the document before members) was re-added. Members discussed the current practice of holding consolidated exams on December 22, which was currently not reflected in current procedure—a friendly amendment was made to the proposed Consolidated Final Examinations Procedure to rectify this. Finally, members agreed to the correction of several minor typographical errors appearing throughout the proposed changes to Section 23 of the University Calendar.

THAT the GFC Academic Standards Committee recommend to the GFC Executive Committee the proposed Assessment and Grading Policy Suite (in UAPPOL) and proposed revisions to University Calendar Section 23 (Academic Regulations), as provided by the Office of the Provost and Vice-President (Academic) and as set forth in Attachments 1 (as amended), 2, 3, 4, 5 (as amended), and 6 (as amended), and the corresponding rescission of GFC Policy Manual Section 52 (Examinations) and Section 61 (Grading System), all to be effective for the Fall Term, 2012.

Ms Schiestel spoke to a series of the external program reviews being conducted by representatives of the University of Alberta, which included a review by the Health Sciences Council of a proposal from Athabasca University for a Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) in Health Disciplines and a review by the Faculty of Education of a proposal from Simon Fraser University (SFU) for a Master of Education (Med) (Curriculum and Instruction Numeracy). Ms Schiestel noted that the University of Alberta's Master of Coaching (MCoach) has been forwarded to the Department of Advanced Education and Technology (AET) and is currently undergoing a system coordination review. She also informed committee members that AET has approved the suspension of the Range and Pasture Management Major within the Bachelor of Science in Agriculture degree program, effective July 1, 2012.
