Members asked about the processes followed when a student did not declare their major and minor according to the regulations.

Dr de Vries noted that academic year and graduation honorifics had come to the GFC ASC's previous meeting for discussion. She explained that the academic year honorifics had been removed from this proposal and were undergoing a different consultation pathway on campus.

Members asked about how graduation honorifics were recorded on parchments.

11. <u>Proposed Changes to Admission Decision Processes for Undergraduate Admissions, Office of the</u>
Registrar

Presenter(s): Amy Dambrowitz, Associate Registrar

Purpose of the Proposal: The Office of the Registrar is proposing changes to the University Calendar that will inform applicants that they must maintain the level of academic performance upon which their offer was made in order to retain offers of admission to undergraduate programs.

Discussion:

Dr Dambrowitz outlined the proposed changes. She indicated that declaring misinformation was a separate, Code of Applicant Behaviour issue, and that this proposal was meant to address only applicants whose final grades indicated that they may be at risk of failure in their program.

Members discussed how different life circumstances could contribute to a drop in admission average, the importance of the standards being clearly communicated to applicants, the implications for students in more

competitive programs, the potential to change the language from "will be revoked" to "may be revoked", and the different ways that high school applicant averages are calculated.
