Post-Secondary Learning Act (PSLA) : The Board of Governors has authority to employ officers, employees or other persons and academic staff members (sections 83 and 84 of the Act) and to appoint the President, Vice-Presidents, Deans and Registrar (sections 81, 82, 21(1) and 20(1) of the Act). The Board has delegated certain of these powers.
	3. UAPPOL Policy : The Faculty Deans Selection and Review Procedures state: "With respect to the procedures for the selection [review] of Faculty Deans, the Board and GFC delegate their approval authority to the GFC Executive Committee for all matters of a routine editorial nature. For matters of a substantive nature, the GFC Executive Committee shall recommend to the Board Human Resources and Compensation Committee (BHRCC). The Provost and Vice-President (Academic) will determine what is of a routine/editorial or substantive nature."
	Note: The Provost and Vice-President (Academic) has determined these proposed amendments to be of a <u>routine/editorial</u> nature.

Faculty Deans Selection Procedure Appendix A: Dean Selection Committees for Individual Faculties

Office of Administrative Responsibility: Office of the Provost and Vice-President (Academic) Approver: General Faculties Council Executive Committee For Definitions of staff categories, refer the Recruitment Policy (Appendix A) Definition and Categories of Academic Staff and Colleagues and (Appendix B) Definition and Categories of Support Staff.

12) NATIVE STUDIES:

- a) Provost and Vice-President (Academic), or designee, Chair.
- b) Vice-President (Research), or designee, Vice-Chair.
- c) Vice-Provost and Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research, or designee.

CURRENT

- d) Four (4) members elected by GFC from Categories A1.0, A2.0, at least three (3) of whom must be from Categories A1.1 or A1.6. Normally, two (2) of the four elected faculty members should be drawn from the tenure track faculty (Category A1.1) of the Faculty of Native Studies. The Provost and Vice-President (Academic) may change this ratio depending on the available faculty members in the pool of tenure track faculty in Native Studies.
- e) Two (2) full-time undergraduate students enrolled in the Faculty of Native studies and selected by students of the Faculty through the Native Studies Students' Association.
- f) If the Native Studies Students' Association (NSSA) is unable to select the required number of undergraduate students, then the Aboriginal Students' Council (ASC) will be responsible for the selection of the undergraduate representatives. If the ASC is unable to select the required number of undergraduate students, then the Students' Union will be responsible for the selection of the undergraduate representatives.
- g) Two (2) members of the Aboriginal community at large, one representing the Metis and one representing the First Nations (one of whom shall be an Elder); both to be nominated by the Faculty of Native Studies Council.
- h) One (1) full-time member of the support staff (Category S1.0 or S2.0) from the Faculty of Native Studies, elected by all support staff (full- and part-time) in the Faculty.

(Total members: 12)

12) NATIVE STUDIES:

- a) Provost and Vice-President (Academic), or designee, Chair.
- b) Vice-President (Research), or designee, Vice-Chair.
- Vice-Provost and Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research, or designee.

PROPOSED

- d) Two (2) faculty members drawn from the tenure track faculty (Category A1.1) of the Faculty of Native Studies, and elected by the Council of the Faculty of Native Studies. Two (2) members elected by GFC from Categories A1.0, A2.0, at least one (1) of whom must be from Categories A1.1 or A1.6. The Provost and Vice-President (Academic) may change this ratio depending on the available faculty members in the pool of tenure track faculty in Native Studies.
- e) Two (2) full-time undergraduate students, at least one of which will be Aboriginal, enrolled in the Faculty of Native studies and selected by students of the Faculty through the Native Studies Students' Association. If the Native Studies Students' Association (NSSA) is unable to select the required number of undergraduate students, then the Students' Union will be responsible for selecting the undergraduate students from the Faculty of Native Studies as the representatives.
- f) One (1) full time graduate student enrolled in the Faculty of Native
 Studies selected by the Native Studies Graduate Students' Association. If
 no association exists the Graduate Students' Association will be
 responsible for selecting a graduate student from the Faculty of Native
 Studies as the representative.
- Two (2) members of the Aboriginal community at large, one representing the Metis and one representing the First Nations (one of whom shall be an Elder); both to be nominated by the Faculty of Native Studies Council.
- h) One (1) full-time member of the support staff (Category S1.0 or S2.0) from the Faculty of Native Studies, elected by all support staff (full- and part-time) in the Faculty.
- i) The process for recruitment of the Dean's Selection Committee shall aspire to create a committee with an Indigenous majority.
