DR. GARY MCPHERSON LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP - BIOGRAPHY			
<p>Dr. Gary McPherson was an extraordinary Albertan who sought to improve the conditions and lives of people through his outstanding leadership ability. Despite being paralyzed due to polio, McPherson was a sports enthusiast throughout his life and helped to transform wheelchair sports into a worldwide sporting movement known as the Paralympics.</p> <p>McPherson was also a leader and advocate for the disabled community serving as Chair of the Premier's Council on the Status of Persons with Disabilities and Vice-Chair of the Alberta Paraplegic Foundation. Gary received significant recognition and awards for his achievements including the prestigious Order of Canada, the Queen's Jubilee Medal, the Alberta Order of Excellence, and both the Edmonton and Alberta Sports Halls of Fame.</p> <p>Above all, Gary dedicated his life to his family and to activities that promoted community development and support for young people.</p> <p>Gary passed away on Saturday, May 8, 2010.</p>
