This program is offered online and provides a unique opportunity for Alberta Local Government officials to study with their counterparts across Canada.

Government Studies has also launched the online Information and Access and Protection of Privacy (IAPP) Certificate Program. This innovative new program responds to the need of both the public and private sectors to engage access and privacy specialists who understand and can appropriately respond to the access and protection of privacy legislation being developed at provincial, national and international levels.
